Pinterest is a hit among teachers for finding and organizing new ideas into “boards.” Use this fetching way to show off student work at the end of the year, highlighting all that has been covered into subjects, or boards,, and using attractive illustrations by students.

Categories for your boards could include:

- Subject overview
- Projects
- 21st-century learning skills
- Chapters of books
- Single concepts with many components (for example, a board for nonfiction text features with pins representing each of those features)
- Character traits with characters from various books assigned to each trait board
- Technology tips and tricks
- Writing process and traits of writing
- Biographical information categories for fictional or historical figures
- "All About Me" student information display
- Individual student portfolios (one pin board for each student to curate pins for portfolio pieces)
